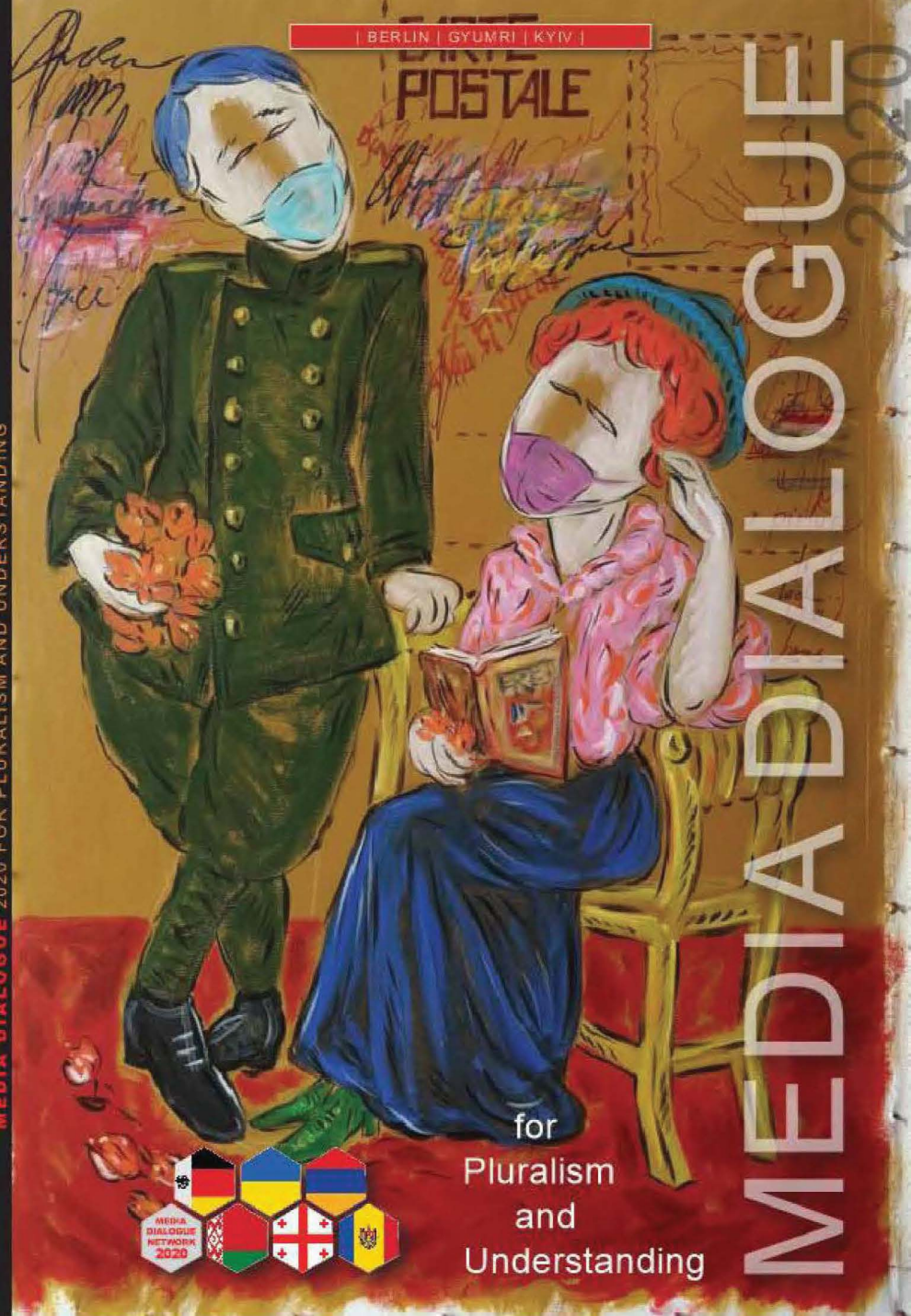

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DAS Projekt „Media Dialogue 2020“ fand unter besonderen Bedingungen statt: Coronabedingt betraten wir Neuland durch Verlagerung des gesamten Projektes ins Internet. Dabei eröffnete die Konferenzsoftware „ZOOM“ neue Möglichkeit zur erfolgreichen Durchführung. Erstmals beteiligte sich der Deutsche Journalistenverband (DJV) am „Media Dialogue“. Der ukrainische Journalistenverband „Union of Ukrainian Journalists“ brachte sich ebenfalls aktiv in die Online-Arbeit ein, genauso wie die Universitäten Lutsk, Lviv, Kyiv und die Caucasus Universität in Tbilisi (Georgien).

An zwei vorgeschalteten Online-Seminaren konnten sich alle Projektteilnehmer:innen aus Moldawien, der Ukraine, Belarus, Georgien und Armenien und Deutschland beteiligen und sich virtuell vernetzen. Unter Anleitung der Mediatrainer entstanden erste Blogartikel, Videofilme und Podcasts.

Eine besondere Bedeutung erhielt der „Media Dialog 2020“ bereits im ersten Projektabschnitt – OK-TV Ludwigshafen zeichnete hier die organisatorische Verantwortung – auch durch die Beteiligung des neu hinzugekommenen moldawischen unabhängigen Journalistenverbandes. Die Keynote-Speaker aus Moldawien lieferten wertvolle und spannende Hintergrundinformationen zum Transnistrienkonflikt und zur Situation der Medien aus der Hauptstadt Chişinău. Unabhängige russische Journalistinnen berichteten über die Mediensituation in der Russischen Föderation mit Blick auf die Konfliktherde in den Ländern der östlichen Partnerschaft.

Hinzu kamen die dramatischen politischen Ereignisse in Belarus. Über deren aktuelle Auswirkungen auf die Medienarbeit in dieser ehemaligen Sowjetrepublik informierte unter anderem unser Projektpartner Andrei Bastunets, als Vorsitzender des unabhängigen belarussischen Journalistenverbandes, live und eindrucksvoll.

Der Angriff der Türkei im Verbund mit Aserbaidschan gegen Armenien im jüngsten Berg-Karabach-Krieg schlug sich ebenfalls unmittelbar auf die Projektarbeit nieder. Armenische Journalist:innen und Keynote-Speaker erläuterten Hintergründe und kommentierten aktuelle Entwicklungen. Dabei spielten Fakenews, Propaganda und Hatespeech als Waffen im Krieg eine besondere Rolle und unterstrichen die Bedeutung der Medien – vor allem in Konfliktsituationen und deren Verläufe.

Die Tragödie des jüngsten Kaukasuskrieges fand ihren Niederschlag vollumfänglich im zweiten Projektteil, für den unser armenischer Partner Mkrtich Tonoyan (ACOSS, Yerevan) sowie die „Academy of Fine Arts“ in Gjumri (Armenien) verantwortlich zeichneten. So zeigten Student:in-

THE project “Media Dialogue 2020” took place under rather special conditions: due to Covid-19, we entered new territory by moving the entire project to the internet. The conference software “Zoom” opened up new possibilities for successful implementation. For the first time, the German Journalists’ Association (DJV) actively participated in the Media Dialogue. The Union of Ukrainian Journalists was also actively involved in the online work, as were the universities of Lutsk, Lviv, Kyiv and the Caucasus University in Tbilisi (Georgia).

All project participants from Moldova, Ukraine, Belarus, Georgia, Armenia and Germany were able to take part in two online seminars and network virtually. Under the guidance of the media trainers, the first blog articles, video films and podcasts were created.

The “Media Dialogue 2020” has already gained a particular significance in this first project stage: OK-TV Ludwigshafen was in charge of the organisation. There was a newly joined Moldovan independent journalists’ association. The keynote speakers from Moldova provided valuable and interesting background information on the Transnistrian conflict and media situation in Chi in u. Independent Russian journalists reported on the media situation in the Russian Federation with a focus on the conflict hotspots in the Eastern Partnership countries.

In addition, dramatic political events in Belarus took place. Among the speakers there was our project partner Andrei Bastunets, a chairman of the independent Belarusian Association of Journalists, who gave a powerful live speech of the current impact of these events on media work in this former Soviet republic.

The attack by Turkey in alliance with Azerbaijan against Armenia in the recent Nagorno-Karabakh war also had a direct impact on the project work. Armenian journalists and keynote speakers explained the background and commented on current developments. Fake news, propaganda and hate speech as weapons in war played a major role and underlined the importance of media, especially in conflict situations and their course.

The tragedy of the recent war in the Caucasus was fully reflected and discussed in the second part of the project, where our Armenian partner Mkrtich Tonoyan (ACOSS, Yerevan) and the Academy of

nen der Akademie unter anderem eine Live-Performance über die Wunden, die der Krieg frisch geschlagen hatte, deren Intensität sich auch nachdrücklich über den Bildschirm verbreitete.

Für die abschließende Projektwoche zeichnete der langjährige Projektpartner, das „Institute of Journalism“ der Taras Shevchenko National University of Kyiv unter Leitung von Yevhen Tsymbalenko, verantwortlich. Die innenpolitische Situation in der Ukraine und die Berücksichtigung der Entwicklung Polens fanden ebenso ihren Niederschlag, wie die Lage im Kriegsgebiet „Donbass“ und der Situation auf der Krim. Die Bedeutung der europäischen Dimension betonte Roger Casale, Gründer der Bürgerrechtsorganisation „New Europeans“, eindrucksvoll.

Der „Media Dialogue 2020“ lieferte einen breiten Fundus an Informationen über die Entwicklung in den Ländern der östlichen Partnerschaft, friedensbedrohende Entwicklungen und deren Bedeutung, auch für den Westen des Kontinents.

Das virtuelle „Media Dialogue 2020“- Projekt wurde zu einem eindrucksvollen Erfolg, weil die kontinuierliche persönliche Zusammenarbeit seit 2015 zuvor eine breite Basis des Vertrauens geschaffen hat.

Fine Arts in Gyumri (Armenia) were in charge. Among other things, students of the Academy presented a live performance about the wounds that the war had freshly inflicted, with an intensity that even spread emphatically through the screens.

Our long-time project partner, the Institute of Journalism at the Taras Shevchenko National University of Kyiv under the direction of Yevhen Tsymbalenko, was responsible for the final project week. The domestic political situation in Ukraine and the consideration of the development of Poland were discussed as well as the situation in Donbass frontline and the situation in Crimea. The importance of the European dimension was impressively emphasised by Roger Casale, founder of the civil rights organisation “New Europeans”.

The “Media Dialogue 2020” provided a wide range of information on development of the Eastern Partnership countries, peace-threatening developments and their significance, including the West of the continent.

The virtual “Media Dialogue 2020” project became an impressive success thanks to the continuous personal cooperation since 2015 and previously created a solid basis of trust.

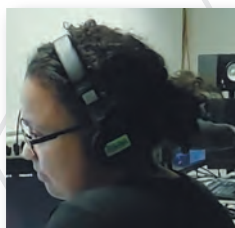

2019 թ. «Մեդիաերկխոսություն համուն ժողովրդավարության և խաղաղության» նախագծի ավարտին ես հույս հայտնեցի, թե 2020-ը նոր ձեռքբերումների տարի կլինի մեզ համար եւ մենք կրկին հնարավորություն կունենանք շարունակել մեր ցանցային աշխատանքներն ու հանդիպումները, ընդգրկելով դրոֆեսիոնալներ եւ նոր գործընկերներ: Մենք ամուսնով այդպես էլ եղավ, սակայն հենց 2020 թվականի սկզբին մենք բոլորս հայտնվեցինք մի անսխաղեղ համաշխարհային իրավիճակում մի երեսույթի դատաճառով, որը կոչվում է Քովիդ-19 դաճողեմիա: Իհարկե հենց սկզբից բոլոր գործընկերների մոտ առաջացավ մտահոգություն, որ գուցե ստիպված ենք լինելու չեղարկել նախագիծը, քանի որ հիմնականում ներառում էր դատավիճակությունների ճանադարհորդություն մասնակից երկրների միջեւ, կոնֆերանսների իրականացում եւ աշխատաժողովներ, որի արդյունքում համագործակցողները համատեղ մեդիա արտադրանք դիտի տային:

Բայց նաեւ հասկանալի էր, որ այդ իրավիճակում, երբ կենսանի շփումը եւ երկրների միջեւ շարժականությունը դադարեցված է, ոչ միայն հեռու տարածությունների միջեւ, այլեւ փոքր, հասցնելով միմեւ «սոցիալական հեռավորության»՝ 2 մետրի, մենք ավելի քան երբեւէ՝ որդես մեդիա ոլորտի ռեֆորմացիայի շատագուցներ, դարտավոր ենք գործել եւ գտնել կենդանի հանդիպումներին այլընտրանք, խոսելու այն ամենի մասին, ինչը մտահոգում էր բոլորին:

Երբ նշանակեցինք արտակարգ առցանց հանդիպում կազմակերպիչների միջեւ եւ կիսվեցինք մեր մտահոգություններով, մի բան դարձավ, որ կազմակերպիչներից ոչ մեկը չի ուզում հանձնվել, այլ ուզում ենք ընդունել այս մարտահրավերը եւ գտնել լուծումներ ու զարգացնել նոր հմտություններ, որը մեզ կօգնի իրականացնել նույն նախագիծը առցանց տարբերակով, առանց փոխելու թեման եւ օբյեկտիվները: Սկզբից դա այդքան էլ ռեալ չէր, թվում, քանի որ ամեն հարցում խնդիրներն ավելի շատ էին քան լուծումները: Սակայն մեր բոլորի միացյալ կամքի շնորհիվ ամեն ինչ հաղթահարվեց ու այս տարվա երկխոսությունը եւս դարձավ իրականություն եւ ձեռք բերեց նոր որակ:

Ի շնորհակալություն Գերմանիայի արտաքին գործերի նախարարության, լիտի նշեմ, որ նրանք ծանոթանալով մեր նախագծի փոփոխության առաջարկներին եւ փորձարարական մոտեցումներին, իրենք էլ վստահեցին մեր համարձակ մտքերն եւ որոշեցին շարունակել մեզ հատկացված ֆինանսական աջակցությունը: Եվ սա շատ կարեւոր էր մեզ համար, այն բարոյական աջակցություն էր եւ քաջալերանք:

IN 2019, during the final conference of the “Media Dialogue for Democracy and Peace” project, I talked about hope that 2020 would become the year of new achievements for our network, being able to expand and continue our networking and meetings, involving new professionals and partners. Mainly, all my hopes came true. One more country Moldova joined our network as well as new organizations from all member countries. However, at the beginning of 2020, we all found ourselves in an unprecedented situation worldwide because of the Pandemic. Of course, the first concern for our network was the cancellation the “Media Dialogue 2020”.

We felt as advocates of the media reforms and freedom of speech, as people representing the media industry we should have taken action. And we started to work on finding alternative ways to implement our project, creating a dialogue platform to speak about what was going on in the world, what was everyone’s concern without any clue how long it would last. We couldn’t be just observers.

And when co-organizers set up an emergency online meeting to share concerns and visions, representing the situation in their countries, one main goal became clear: nobody wanted to give up. Instead, we wanted to take on this challenge and find new approaches, solutions as well as to develop new skills that would help us implement the same project online without changing the topic and objectives. At first, this did not seem realistic as we were facing more problems than solutions. Our joint efforts helped us to overcome the obstacles. Thus, we realized another year’s “Media Dialogue” must have new implementation ideas.

It is worth mentioning that this year has been much more difficult for Armenia. A terrible war in the Artsakh (Nagorno-Karabakh) region and along the borders of Armenia provoked by Turkey and Azerbaijan (involving jihadist mercenaries from the Near East and Libya) resulted in a catastrophe for Armenia. There were thousands of casualties, destroyed infrastructures, lost territories, a breakdown of geopolitical positions, thousands of refugees, military prisoners, and cultural vandalism. In addition, the aggressors used all possible media platforms worldwide to disseminate propaganda and fake news, misleading the world community. Our Media Dialogue platform has become a platform to elucidate war in Artsakh, informing about military aggression, genocidal acts and war crimes, and the history of Artsakh’s struggle for independence. We had a chance to show the war directly from Artsakh, the suffering of civilians because of Covid-19 and heavy shelling and missiles of Turkish-Azerbaijani aggression.

Եվ այս փոխըմբռնման մթնոլորտը, որ ձեւավորվել էր մեր միջեւ, հնարավոր դարձրեց այդ ամենը: Հայաստանի համար այս տարին ամվել ծանր էր, քանի որ Քովիդի բերած սոցիալ-տնտեսական դժվարություններին միացավ նաեւ արյունալի ղատերազմն Արցախում, որի հետեւանքն աղետալի եղավ Հայաստանի համար՝ ղարտություն, տարածքային կորուստներ եւ աշխարհաքաղաքական դիրքերի թուլացում ու բացմիազար մարդկային կորուստներ: Մեղիա երկխոսությունը այս ըմբացքում ծառայեց նաեւ ղլատֆորմ Արցախի խոսքը ղուսաբանելու՝ առցանց հանդիղղումների միջոցով ներկայացնելու տեսակետներ մասնակից երկրկների ժողմալիստների միղղություններին եւ Գերմանիայի ղառլամենտին, որոնք մասնակցեցին մեր առցանց հանդիղմանը:

Մենք հնարավորություն ունեցանք ղատերազմը ղուսաբենել հենց Արցախից, ներկայացնելով ռմբակոծության տակ աղղող խաղաղ բնակչության տառաղանքները:

Եվ մեկ անգամ եւս ուզում եմ կրկնել. «Մեղիաերկխոսություն» նախագծերի շարունակականությունը շատ կարեւոր է ոչ միայն Հայաստանի, այլեւ՝ ընդհանուր առմամբ աշխարհում խոսքի ազատության հաստատման համար, մեր եւ այլ երկրների միջեւ «մեղիա կամուրջ» կառուցելու եւ փոխըմբռնման մթնոլորտ հաստատելու համար:

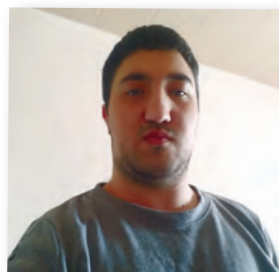

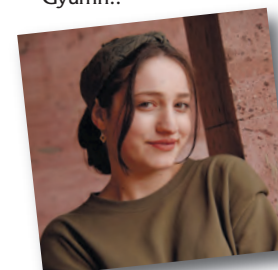

Українська команда – це команда професіоналів медіагалузі. Дехто з них працює журналістами в українських масмедіа, дехто – фрилансером або має власний блог. Члени команди, які працюють в університетах, роблять все для того, щоб молоді журналісти знали всі тонкощі професії, дотримувалися стандартів і досягали успіхів.

Потужна команда складалася з організаторів у різних куточках України: Луцьку, Львові, Одесі та Києві. У проєкті взяли участь чотири університети: Київський національний університет імені Тараса Шевченка, Волинський національний університет імені Лесі Українки, Львівський національний університет імені Івана Франка та Національний університет «Одеська юридична академія». Науково-педагогічні працівники кожного з цих університетів доклали великих зусиль до зміцнення «Медіадіалогу 2020». Проєкт також підтримала Національна спілка журналістів України.

Зокрема, Ліна Куш, перша секретарка спілки, поділилася своїми враженнями про «Медіадіалог»:

«У сучасному світі медіа не просто формують суспільну думку, – вони впливають на життя людей. Журналістам, якічують свою аудиторію та знають потреби, вкрай важливо бути проактивними, залучати до широкого діалогу владу і громадськість. Моделлю такого дискусійного майданчика і проєкт «Медіадіалог». Це гарна школа для молодих журналістів, які отримують і професійні навички, і досвід обговорення складних суспільних проблем.

Особливою цінністю для мене те, що учасники проєкту представляють різні країни Східного партнерства: Україну, Грузію, Вірменію, Білорусь, Молдову. Всі ми – свідками складних і навіть драматичних суспільних процесів. Я бачу реальну підтримку і солідарність серед учасників «Медіадіалогу»: вони не залишаються осторонь і активно реагують на незаконні арешти колег або загострення збройних конфліктів. Я вдячна за цю атмосферу взаємодопомоги й толерантності, яка панує під час наших зустрічей».

Українські етапи проєкту були б не такими успішними без участі журналістів-практиків і їхніх зв'язків із масмедіа нашої країни. Саме практики допомагали нам організовувати зустрічі з відомими журналістами, редакторами, відвідувати телестудії та громадські організації, які спеціалізуються на розвитку медіагалузі. Нашим найактивнішим практиком – заступник голови Волинської обласної організації Національної спілки журналістів України, головний редактор «Волинської газети», секретар Національної спілки журналістів Володимир Данилюк.

Ukrainian team is the team of the media sphere professionals. Some of them work as journalists in Ukrainian mass media, some of them are freelancers or have their own blogs. The team members, who work at universities, do everything they can so that young journalists of Ukrainian mass media know all peculiarities of the profession, comply with the standards and achieve success.

A powerful team included the organizers from different corners of Ukraine: Lutsk, Lviv, Odesa and Kyiv. Four universities took part in the project: Taras Shevchenko National University of Kyiv, Lesya Ukrainka National University of Volyn, Ivan Franko National University of Lviv and National University "Odesa Law Academy". Pedagogical staff of every mentioned university made an enormous effort to strengthen "Media Dialogue 2020". The project was also supported by the National Union of Journalists of Ukraine.

In particular, Lina Kushch, the first secretary of the Union shared her impressions about "Media Dialogue":

«In the modern world media not only inform but also form public opinion, they have an impact on people's lives. Journalists, who hear their audience and know its necessities, should be proactive and get engaged in the wide dialogue with authorities and civil society. "Media Dialogue" is the example of such discussion platform. It is a great school for young journalists who get both professional skills and experience of complicated social problems discussions.

As for me, the special value of the project is that the participants represent different countries of Eastern partnership: Ukraine, Georgia, Armenia, Belarus, Moldova. We are all witnesses of the hard and sometimes dramatic social processes. I see real support and solidarity among the "Media Dialogue" participants. They do not stay away and actively react to the illegal arrests of their colleagues or escalation of armed conflicts. I am grateful for this atmosphere of mutual support and tolerance which prevails during our meetings».

Ukrainian stages of the project would not be so successful without the participation of practitioners and their connections with mass media of our country. The practitioners were the ones who helped us to organise the meetings with famous journalists, editors as well as to visit television studios and nonprofit organizations which specialise on media sphere development. Our most active practitioner is the deputy head of Volyn Regional Organization of the National Union of Journalists of Ukraine, Editor-in-chief of "Volyn Newspaper", the Secretary of the National Union of Journalists of Ukraine Volodymyr Danyliuk.

Володимир був одним з ініціаторів проєкту ще в 2015 році, а після нашого нового досвіду проведення онлайн-проєкту у 2020 році, він зауважив таке:

«"Медіадіалог" – це унікальний для України проєкт, який за багато років свого розвитку виконав низку важливих місій завдяки високому рівню підготовки журналістів і студентів факультетів журналістики з усієї України. Всі його учасники працюють із застосуванням сучасних принципів західних медіа, базуючись на фундаменті непорушного забезпечення принципів свободи слова та плюралізму. Важливість полягає в тому, що крім тренінгів із залученням професіоналів, реалізовується широка програма наукових конференцій, відбуваються предметні зустрічі з представниками інституцій громадянського суспільства, органів влади і дійсно цікавими особистостями. Під час війни і конфліктів в Україні та інших країнах-учасницях, також надважливою функцією «Медіадіалогу» є протидія фейкам та агресивній пропаганді. "Медіадіалог" довів свою важливість та необхідність, а в майбутньому стане ще міцнішим і досягне ще більше позитивних результатів».

Навчання журналістів в Україні відбувається в різних областях, в різних університетах, з різними рівнями підготовки. Без теоретиків, науково-педагогічних працівників, які прагнуть покращити якість медіапродуктів шляхом покращення знань своїх вихованців. Одним із таких фахівців є Юрій Залізник, доцент Львівського національного університету імені Івана Франка, ділиться враженнями про «Медіадіалог»:

«Колосальна різниця між двома поняттями "слухати" і "чути". Можна брати участь у процесі комунікації як пасивний слухач, а можна почути співрозмовника і сприйняти його наратив – дозволяти чужим думкам проникати глибше у свідомість, вмикати режим аналізу та належним чином реагувати. Саме у другому випадку ми можемо говорити про комунікацію, а не про видимість спілкування. Та й чужі думки тоді перестають бути геть чисто чужими: належне сприйняття робить тебе співпричетним до досліджень, досвіду і переживань інших людей, ринків, культур. Проєкт "Медіадіалог" у цьому розумінні – унікальне явище. Він дозволяє різним поколінням (професорам, практикам, студентам, активістам) налагоджувати діалог комунікації, замислюватися над причинами наявних розбіжностей, називати речі своїми іменами задля подолання непорозуміння та максимально широко виявляти зацікавлення до тем, які досі були не достатньо вивченими, а іноді навіть несподіваними. Поки ми не вміємо дивуватися інших і дивуватися самі, знаємо, як розповідати цікаві історії, а також маємо бажання чути інших, доти наш діалог потрібен. Його стимулюють виклики сучасності та чимало проблем у професії медійника і громадах по всьому світові».

Volodymyr was one of the initiators of the project back in 2015 and after the project implementation in 2020 he marked the following:

«"Media Dialogue" is a unique project for Ukraine, which for many years of its development has been fulfilling a number of important missions through the high level of training for journalists and students of journalism faculties from all over Ukraine. All participants work with the application of modern principles of the Western media, based on the foundation of the inviolable provision of the freedom of speech principles and pluralism. The importance lies in the fact that in addition to training involving professionals, a wide program of scientific conferences is implemented, there are substantive meetings with representatives of civil society institutions, government agencies and truly interesting people. During wars and conflicts in Ukraine and other participating countries, the function of the "Media Dialogue" in counteracting fakes and aggressive propaganda is also crucial. "Media Dialogue" has proved its importance and necessity, and in future it will become even stronger as well as achieve even more positive results».

Journalists are trained in Ukraine in different fields, at different universities of different levels. Without theorists, research and pedagogical staff, who seek to improve the quality of media products by improving the knowledge of their students, the media sphere would fail its mission. One of such specialists is Yuriy Zaliznyak, Associate Professor of Ivan Franko National University of Lviv, who shares his impressions of "Media Dialogue":

«There is a huge difference between the two concepts of "listening" and "hearing". You can participate in the communication process as a passive listener, and you can hear the interlocutor and perceive their narrative to allow other people's thoughts to get deeper into consciousness, turn on the analysis mode and respond appropriately. That's when we can speak about communication, not of the communication likeness. Other people's thoughts then stop feeling alien: proper perception makes you involved in research and experiences of other people, markets, cultures. In this sense, "Media Dialogue" project is a unique phenomenon. It allows different generations (professors, practitioners, students, activists) to establish effective communication, reflect on the differences, call everything by its name to overcome misunderstandings and show sincere interest in topics that have not been sufficiently studied and sometimes even unexpectedly brought up. As long as we know how to surprise others and ourselves, we know how to tell interesting stories, and we also want to hear others, we need our dialogue. It is driven by modern challenges and many challenges in media profession and communities around the world».

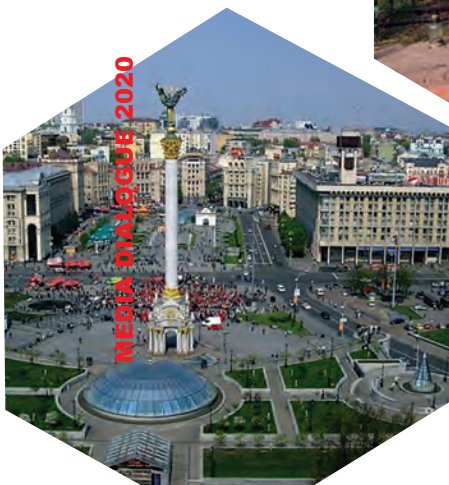

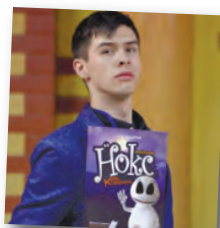

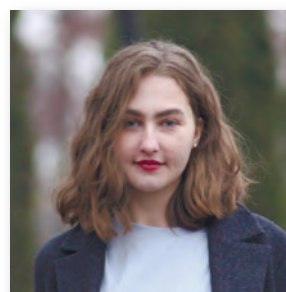

პროექტი „მედია დიალოგი 2020“ საქართველოსთვის ერთ-ერთი მნიშვნელოვან პლატფორმას წარმოადგენს, რომლის ფარგლებშიც აკადემიის სხვადასხვა სფეროს წარმომადგენლებს შესაძლებლობა მიეცათ პროფესიონალ ჟურნალისტებთან და სტუდენტებთან გაერთიანდნენ და განიხილონ მედიასთან დაკავშირებული სენსიტიური თემები, რომელსაც, თავისთავად, გავლენა აქვს ქვეყანაში დემოკრატიის, პლურალიზმისა და სტაბილურობის ჩამოყალიბებაზე.

THE Project “Media Dialogue 2020” represents one of the foremost platforms for Georgia, which provides an opportunity for academics from various fields to unite and discuss sensitive media issues with professional journalists and students, which in turn has an impact on democracy, pluralism and stability in the country.

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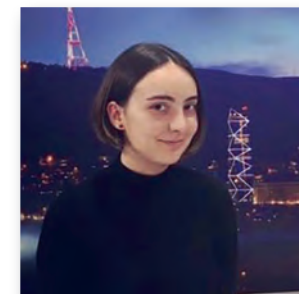
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MEDIA DIALOGUE 2020

Surely, the Media Dialogue project brought an important contribution to the development of media system in each participating countries, through the journalists-attendees of the events.

Irina Odobescu: "Participating in the Media Dialogue 2020 project was an opportunity for me to discuss with colleagues journalists from various countries and to find out from the first source about the situation at national level. The experts presented documented information and after the discussions we better understood the addressed topics. The practical part, making the thematic video, was an attempt, but also an impetus to find out new information. I bring sincere thanks to the entire organizational team for Media dialogue 2020".

Constantin Uzdris: "For me, this project was an opportunity to communicate and exchange views with colleagues from different countries! Usually it's not just new things, or skills that matter in such projects, it's the connections between people! Unfortunately, the pandemic kept us online only and we did not have the opportunity to interact directly with our colleagues. In the future, I hope to have the opportunity to see each other directly".

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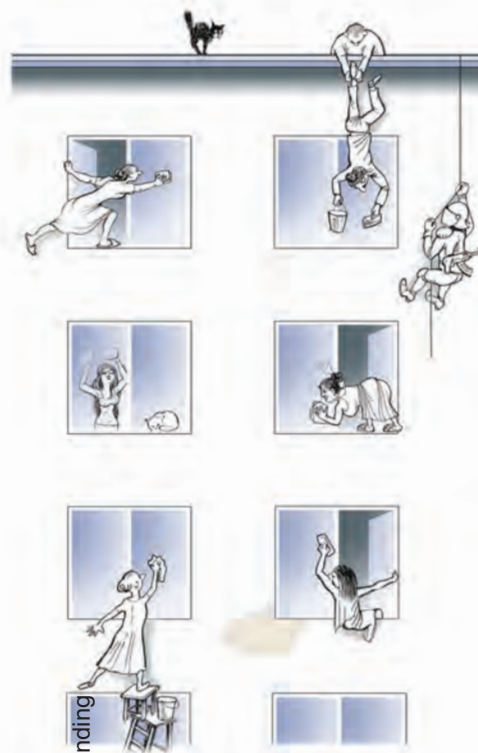
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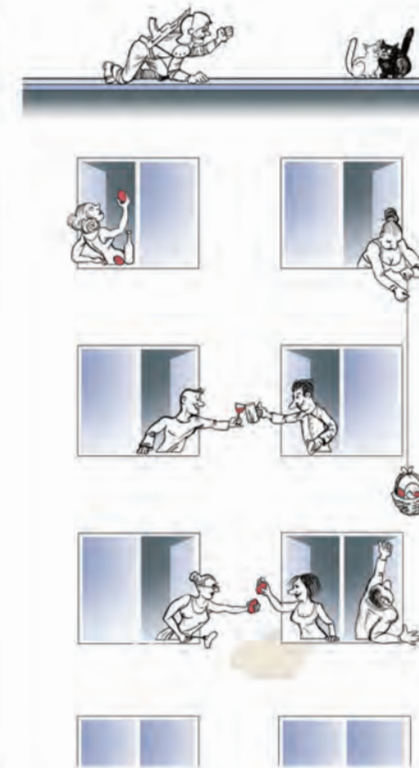

BELOUSSIAN JOURNALISTS IN DANGER:
OPEN LETTER (INSTEAD OF FOREWORD)
WE ARE IN SOLIDARITY WITH JOURNALISTS FROM BELARUS!

Every day we receive alarming reports of detentions, physical and psychological harassment of journalists working in Belarus.

Since August 2020, the Belarusian Association of Journalists has registered:

497 detentions of journalists, 119 of which ended with administrative arrests;

68 cases of violence and injuries of journalists;

27 media workers are behind bars;

at least 50 journalists under criminal prosecution;

140 searches (including current events) and inspections in the apartments of journalists and editorial offices;

more than 100 news and media websites blocked;

10 print media outlets forced to stop their work.

We stand together with the Belarusian Association of Journalists and its 1500 members. We are outraged by the Supreme Court's decision to liquidate the association. This decision confirmed that the authorities of the Republic of Belarus continue to attack the media and civil society. But it is not a crime for journalists to do their job.

Persecution of journalists for their professional activities is unacceptable for any civilized state.

Restriction of a journalist's labour right is a violation of citizens' right to information, a restriction of freedoms that are fundamental to any democratic society.

In the current situation, it is our duty to take all necessary action to end the unlawful pressure on the human rights and journalistic community in Belarus as well as to prevent even more brutal and widespread violations.

All participants of the Media Dialogue project show solidarity with the Belarusian Association of Journalists and with journalists in Belarus, support the persecuted media workers and dissemination of truthful information about the violence against journalists. We call on the Belarusian authorities to stop prosecuting journalists and guarantee their labour rights.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION AND TIMELINE

THE international project “Media Dialogue for Pluralism and Understanding” is a continuation of the project series “Media Dialogue”. In 2020, it was held with the participation of public organizations, representatives of educational and scientific institutions, journalists, top managers of leading media and business from Ukraine, Germany, Armenia, Georgia, Moldova and Belarus.

The “Media Dialogue” project is designed to establish friendship, which allows to analyze the experience of each participating country in resolving conflicts, as well as to share successful models of democracy and the development of civil society, interconnection, pluralism and protection of human rights.

The current project was implemented online. This format was proposed due to the pandemic. Such experience allowed the organisers to involve more participants and a significant number of experts.

Reminder: The project was launched in 2015 by the leader of the open TV channel “OK TV Ludwigshafen” (Ludwigshafen, Germany) Wolfgang Ressmann and the leader of the NGO “Bennohaus” (Münster, Germany) Johann Muschholt. It was funded by the Federal Foreign Office of Germany. Later, more partners joined the project: the NGO “Youth for the Media” (Münster, Germany), the NGO “Forum of Ukrainian Journalists” (Lutsk, Ukraine), Taras Shevchenko National University of Kyiv (Kyiv, Ukraine), AKOS Cultural NGO (Yerevan, Armenia), Belarusian Union of Journalists (Minsk, Belarus).

The project results include publications in the media, publication of a brochure, participants’ media products, creation of videos, audio materials and publications for social networks, creation and support of Ukrainian civil media “Infocenter”, creation of the internship program for students.

1 - Online seminars

We conducted two online seminars to get back on track before the start of the project. It helped us to test the format and it worked amazingly!

Topic: How is Covid-19 influencing the media systems of Ukraine, Armenia and Georgia – three countries currently going through war or frozen conflict?

Date: August 31, 2020

Seminar 2

Topic: How is Covid-19 influencing the media systems of Belarus and Germany – two countries with different political systems?

Date: September 10, 2020

2 Berlin Stage

Date: October 19-23, 2020

It was the first time we went through technical issues, adjusted to the situation, kept a positive spirit and even improved our moderation skills!

3 Armenia Stage

Date: November 24-26, 2020

This stage proved that despite the distance and online format, we could feel the hospitality, see the cultural peculiarities and even see how rich the cuisine is!

4 Ukraine Stage

Date: December 14-17, 2020

This stage proved how responsible collaboration of Kyiv, Lutsk, Odesa and Lviv united different fields, nations, religions and political regimes. And it worked perfectly!



Stages Description

Germany – Berlin stage October 19.23.2020

The Berlin Stage in October 2020 was a week-long conference following two previous online seminars that created a friendly, collaborative group among the participants and organisers.

The original plan was to hold the conference as a hybrid online and face-to-face event in the German Bundestag – a very important political place that symbolises active democracy. However, we are all used to Corona coming in the way of our plans, and our previous online seminars demonstrated that we can use Zoom as a platform for exchange successfully. Due to Covid-19, at the last minute, we decided to hold the conference entirely online.

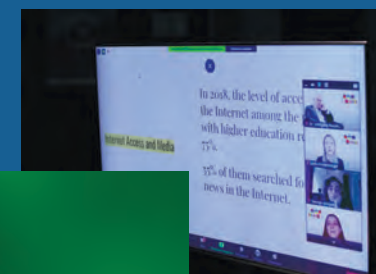
Each day had a special theme as a focus topic. For example, Monday was about the media system in Germany, Tuesday about the current situation in the participating countries, Wednesday about media literacy as the mechanism to oppose propaganda, Thursday was about the question how news is made in German public broadcasting as well as the role of Russian Media in Germany and Friday was about the importance of photojournalism.

In addition to the lively discussions after the keynotes, the Media Dialogue participants actively produced blog articles, videos and a podcast, which were supervised by media trainers at workshops.

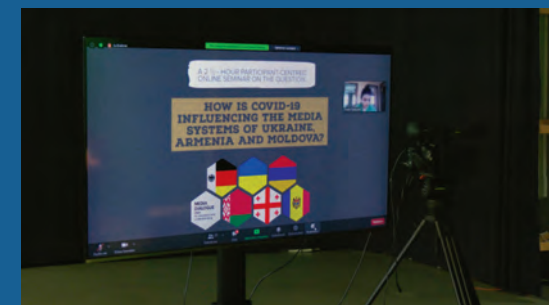

Before the pandemic, before starting the project we had already decided to hold the Armenian stage in Gyumri city this time. And with our Armenian team we had several meetings in Gyumri, advertising our network and looking for interested new partner institutions locally to cooperate with us during the meeting. But, unfortunately, due to Covid-19 restrictions we had to cancel a trip to Gyumri and hold a conference and bunch of production workshops with new partners online. Since Gyumri was a new city for our MD project and completely unknown for participants, we decided to combine an online conference with pop up short life stream interruption from outdoor sightseeing sides of Gyumri to introduce the city and subculture to MD participants. We got Gyumri Art Academy and Tsayg Media Training Studio as new partner organizations joining us within a year and their contribution to our production part of the project became significant. We created 2 studios of real time online meetings in both locations and besides main participants both studios were open for just interested audiences to follow the activities from the project room. Academy students initiated a beautiful perforce related to our topic about transformation of news. And Media Studio students started making short documentary films, introducing Gyumri city and cultural heritage of Gyumri. In the end, as a part of our tradition, we held a final conference online where we summarized the project week and awarded certificates to the participants, evaluating their participation.

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MEDIA DIALOGUE 2020

International project “Media Dialogue for Democracy and Understanding” is a continuation of a series of common international projects “Media Dialogue”. In 2020 was the fifth project which involved NGO’s members, social activists, teachers, scientists, journalists, top-managers of media and business from Ukraine, Germany, Armenia, Georgia, Moldova and Belarus.

“Media Dialogue” project was created for increasing and making better international and intercultural communication of countries with the difficult political situation, countries where are present or finishing in different way military | armed conflicts. The main aim of the project is starting friendly international dialogue, which helps to analyze the experience of neighboring countries in solving conflicts. Helps to exchange successful models of realization and standing democracy, developing social society, understanding, pluralism and human rights protection.

The current project was conducted in online-format. We should use this way because of COVID-19 pandemic situation didn’t let us travel and meet. But, from the other side, such a way lets us to involve not only the participants but also many experts: Vice-Rectors of Taras Shevchenko National University of Kyiv, Head of “Livyi Bereh” online-mediaportal, volunteers from uncontrolled Ukrainian territory, scholars from Algeria, Syria and Egypt. We discussed how to change educational processes, how to work in online media, how to realise journalistic functions on uncontrolled territory and how to be without support in foreign country in pandemic time.

The project was started in 2015 thanks of initiative and supervising the Head of Open Channel “OKTV Ludwigshafen” (Ludwigshafen, Germany) Wolfgang Ressmann, the Head of “Bennohouse” NGO (Munster, Germany) Johim Musskholt. Financial support by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Germany. Later, the main partners became “Youth for Media” NGO (Munster, Germany), “Forum of Ukrainian Journalists” NGO (Lutsk, Ukraine), Taras Shevchenko National University of Kyiv (Kyiv, Ukraine), “AKOS” NGO (Yerevan, Armenia), Journalists Union of Belarus (Minsk, Belarus).

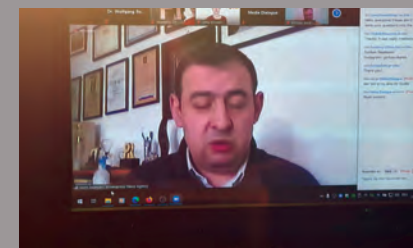
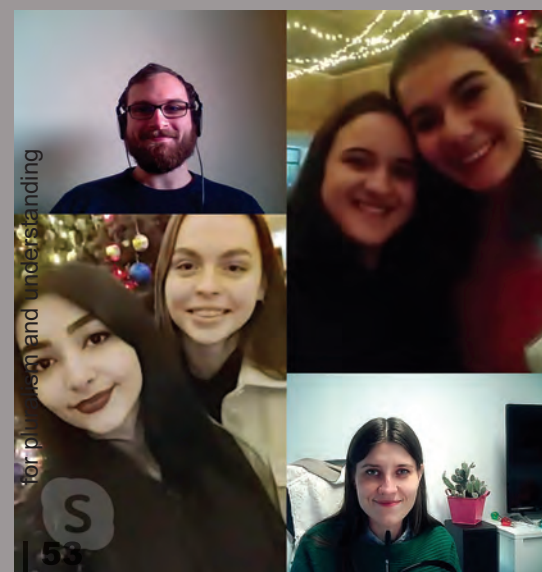
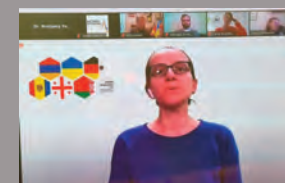

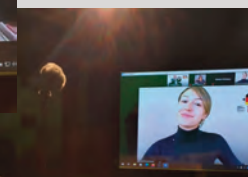
Lena Kronenbürger, "You feel the impact every second"

WE have long known that emotions influence a variety of cognitive processes that are essential for learning. But when you see first-hand how true this statement is, you are still surprised. This is how it felt when we became a part of the "Media Dialogue" project in 2020. What struck immediately was the sense of belonging that the organising team, led by Dr Wolfgang Ressmann, naturally exudes without having to emphasise it. We would like to thank all the participants, keynote speakers, the technical team, the media trainers and the organisers (such a wonderful team!) for the great cooperation, the critical and curious questions and the lively exchange via Zoom and e-mail which still continues. We believe that everything heard and seen will accompany us for a very long time, raising questions and encouraging us to learn more about the current situations in Ukraine, Moldova, Georgia, Belarus and Armenia. The "Media Dialogue" project does not take place 365 days a year, but you feel the impact every second.

I think everyone did a great job, it shows that especially young journalists are interested in the mass media, all information platforms and their work. 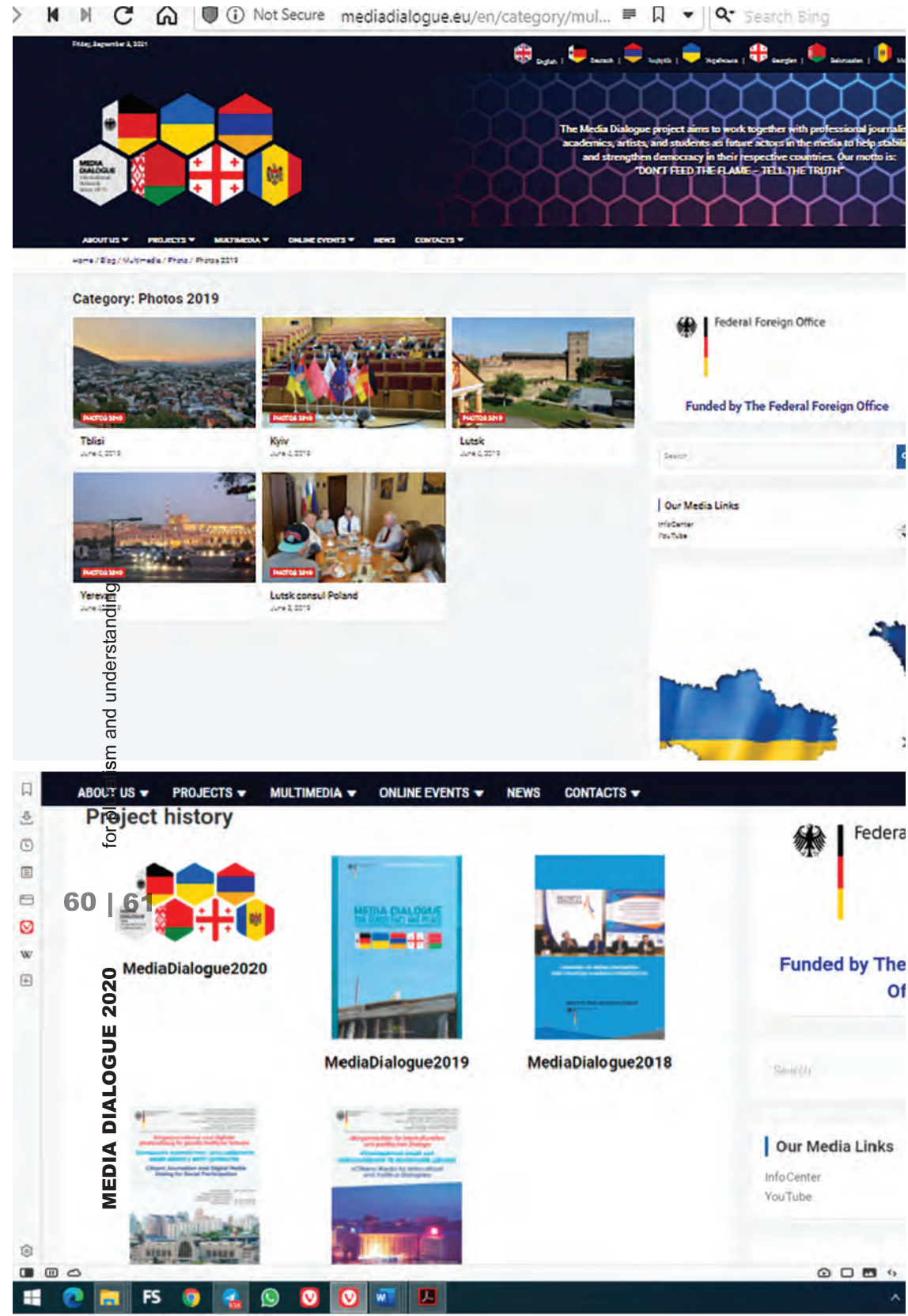


WEBSITE DESCRIPTION

OWN website is kind of virtual “home address” of our already established network. Though our project still uses the blog in < infocenter.com.ua/ >, which has been another great experience of cooperation for us, but still co-organizers found it important to have our own website with domain names. As soon as we got that task, we invited some participants of Armenia who were graphic designers, to work on the transmission of the web appearance and make sketches, afterwards we hired professional webmasters and soft developers to make it for us. But what was exciting that we kept collaborating with web masters and administrators during all process of website development. Thanks to this approach it became sort of collective work for our network with lot of fun. The most difficult part of the website building was designing the structure of content, finding way for easier navigation and make it user friendly. That was not so easy, since we wanted to have pages with native languages of all participant countries, but main content in English, since it was our working language. Reflecting yearly activities of media dialogue meeting with all multilayer activities is main principle of the website logic and each participating country will have their own page and get access to that page for any kind of topic related update that they find it necessary to do. No “censorship”. Now we can announce Media Dialogue International Network is established and we think about sustainability and independent web platform, which becomes next stage of network development. Especially this year when during Pandemic situation we had to continue working online and for that we started thinking also about developing online tools and skills for professional cross boarder work.

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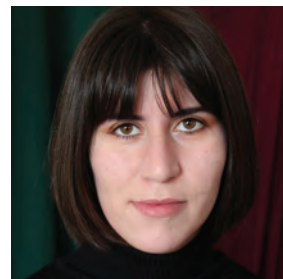

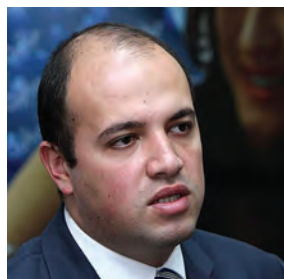

Took a part in professional training programs: researched local media in the US (2000), Belgium and the Netherlands (2000), China (2003), Georgia (2005). Worked as Associate Professor of Journalism at the Bohdan Khmelnytsky National University of Cherkasy. Since May 2019 – member of the Steering Committee of the European Federation of Journalists.

WHEN we started the „Media Dialogue“ in 2015 in Ukraine we did not expect that in 2021 journalist organisations from mostly all countries of the „Eastern Partnership“ would be networking together with media and journalism departments of 6 Universities, Cultural NGOs and representatives of public access channels. The main goal of the project is to support civil societies, professional and citizen journalists in using the fundamental right for freedom of expression and freedom of speech as key rights for democratic development in Europe. In this sense, “Don’t feed the flame – tell the truth” becomes one of the main targets which means information is fundamental to overcome open wars and frozen conflicts.

The „Media Dialogue“ is not only a seminar for participating students. The project gives them a chance to use their own voice, learn to produce crossmedial products for a bigger audience and share the experience of their generations in post-soviet countries.

The “Media Dialogue” grows bigger and bigger as the platform for solidarity with journalists under pressure from their state authorities like in Belarus.

The “Media Dialogue” is also a way to connect the audiences of the participating countries and develop the societies of the “Eastern Partnership” countries in the European Union.

The challenges for future “Media Dialogue” lay in making contributions in freedom of speech and press, democratic and peaceful development.

In order to accomplish that, we need to join forces and do the following:

- find new partners in the civil societies of all Eastern partnership countries;
- broaden support and funding;
- support new connections between East and West in solidarity;
- reach bigger audiences in the participating countries

“Media Dialogue” is the project which shows different perspectives and gives hope for the future in our “Common European House”.
